Attention: U12 Parents/Guardians

Welcome to Calgary NorthWest Ringette Association's 2025/2026 Evaluations

On behalf of the Calgary NorthWest Ringette Association (NW Ringette), thank you for joining us for the 2025/2026 ringette season. NW Ringette's mission is to develop young athletes in their ringette and life skills through competition, teamwork and fair play, as well as foster their lifelong enjoyment of the sport.

The evaluation process is the most difficult task for any ringette association. There are a considerable number of factors that go into organizing and evaluating our athletes. Each year, the NW Ringette Board of Directors (the Board) reviews the previous season's evaluations process and offers changes and improvements to make the experience better.

We remain committed to our evaluations objective: *To provide an objective, accurate, and transparent evaluation and team formation process*. In keeping with this objective, we have made changes to the evaluations process that affect your athlete. Here is what you can expect this year:

2025/2026 Evaluations Updates

Changes to the Universal Athlete Assessment (UAA) Skates

- Skaters will be placed in the first game play evaluation (scrimmage) based on their UAA scores AND predicted player pathway (see definition in the Evaluations and Team Formation Policy).
- In the event of a fall during the UAA, no additional skate will be allowed, as UAA scores will not be the only
 indicator for scrimmage placement. Players may be asked to redo the station if the task was done
 incorrectly.

Changes to Scrimmage Skates

- Skaters whose evaluation scores fall noticeably below the average may be considered for placement in a
 lower tier during the next round of scrimmages. Top ranked skaters in the top tiered game play evaluation
 may be removed from further game play evaluations after one (1) game play, if it is clear they will be
 placed in the highest tier. This change is designed to help evaluators evaluate players closer in skill level.
 - The amount of skaters removed from play is at the discretion of the Evaluations Committee, taking
 into account the number of skaters in the age group, evaluations scores, and where natural breaks in
 evaluations scores occur.
 - Skaters ranked at the bottom in the lowest tier of game play evaluation may be removed from further
 participation to help evaluators evaluate players closer in skill level. This will only occur if their scores
 and player pathway clearly support this placement. This decision will be made by the Evaluations
 Committee.

Here is what else you can expect this year:

• At the U12 level, parents/caregivers/family members are no longer allowed in the dressing room to help with equipment or tie skates. If help is needed, athletes must leave the dressing room.

- U12 skills evaluations will be as per the Ringette Alberta guidelines for Universal Athlete Assessment (UAA). The UAA includes four stations with timed drills: 1) Forwards/backwards speed skate, 2) Agility weave with the ring around pylons, 3) Parallel start and stop drill, and 4) Butterfly transitional skate.
- The first ice time is designed to get the athletes on the ice after being off all summer. This is not the official skills evaluation, but an opportunity to practice each station and know what to expect. The drills will be timed, but only as a trial run for volunteers. This ice time is optional to attend.
- For the U12 level, there will also be two, learn-to-play full ice sessions that are completely optional and not evaluated. These are designed to help players new to full ice ringette feel more comfortable and do their best at evaluations.
- The next ice time will be the official UAA skate. All stations are timed and the player's aggregate score will be used to determine the initial groupings for the scrimmage component of the evaluations. All players get two skates through each station.
- The first ringette scrimmage will follow the UAA skate. The scrimmages will be evaluated by experienced
 coaches who do not have children in U12. Evaluators will be looking at ring control, defensive play, skating
 skills and game sense. You can view the Evaluation Rubric here.

Notifications

• Athletes will be notified by email of their upcoming ice time. It is critical that you regularly check and thoroughly read each email from the association. The emails contain critical information on the process and what is coming up next for your athlete. You will also be notified (through email) if your athlete's evaluations are complete.

Team Formation

• Once the evaluations process is complete, the teams will be formed. You will not be told where your athlete has finished by the Division coordinators. The next email you will receive will be from your head coach. Note: your first practice could happen very quickly after the team has been formed.

Evaluations Volunteers

The sign-up for evaluation volunteers will be available next week. You will receive an email from the
volunteer coordinator with further instructions. These roles count toward your NW Ringette volunteer
requirement.

The evaluations process can be a stressful time for many players and their families. It is important to prepare your athlete in a way that does not put undue pressure on them. Please encourage them to do their best, but veer away from telling them they will make a certain level. If your player does not make the level you think they should have, remember how you handle the situation will directly impact how your child handles it.

Many volunteers are dedicating countless hours of their time to help make these two weeks go smoothly - we ask that you treat everyone with respect and patience as we work through any issues that may arise. With your help, we can ensure our athletes have an amazing experience this year playing ringette.

Please find attached the evaluation schedule for your division. Your player will not skate in all the ice times listed here. You will be notified of your specific ice times as soon as possible.

Feel free to approach any member of your Division Coordination team at any time with questions, comments or concerns. Our volunteers are here to help guide you through the process.
